## How Impossibly Difficult It Is To Forgive the Unforgivable!

In Matthew 6:12 Jesus taught us to pray, "Forgive us our sins, just as we also have forgiven those who sin against us." He went on to say, "Forgive other people when they sin against you. If you do, your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> But if you do not forgive the sins of other people, your Father will not forgive your sins." Matthew 6:14 NIRV

Erika Kirk publicly forgave the man who murdered her husband while he was speaking on the campus of Utah Valley University. "My husband, Charlie, he wanted to save young men just like the one who took his life. That young man, that young man - - On the cross our Savior said, 'Father, forgive them, for they [do] not know what they do.' That man, that young man - - I forgive him!" Mrs. Kirk said through tears as 60,000 people attending the memorial service stood in applause. "I forgive him because it was what Christ did and is what Charlie would do," she said. "The answer to hate is not hate. The answer we know from the gospel is love and always love. Love for our enemies and love for those who persecute us."

You or I might wonder if we would ever be able to do that. I have held a grudge for much lesser things. At times we feel like "Some things are just unforgivable!" I'm glad Jesus didn't feel that way. His blood paid for every one of the most evil acts we can think of. He truly wants us to forgive like that. "Be kind and tender to one another. Forgive one another, just as God forgave you because of what Christ has done." Ephesians 4:32 NIRV

After the parable of the Unforgiving Servant he said, "This is how my Father in heaven will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart." Matthew 18:35 NIRV This may be humanly impossible, but with God, all things are possible! And yes, he even forgives us when we fall short in our forgiveness of others.
